Davidson Plaintiff:	78 J.E. Baker, Jr., George Fryhofer Leigh May, Atlanta, GA and Gail Ashworth, Nashville	\$105,500,000	An infant rear-seat passenger in a Chrysler minivan was killed when the seat in front of collapsed onto him
Shelby Plaintiff:	143 Larry Morris and Jeremy M. Knowles, Alexander City, AL & Richard Charlton, Memphis	\$58,278,000	Two passengers were killed in a Chrysler minivan crash that implicated both the B-Pillar design and the seat belts
Shelby Plaintiff:	1347 J. Houston Gordon, Covington and Keisha Moses, Memphis	\$43,800,000	A six year old boy was left paralyzed after a serious crash. He blamed the design of the rear-seat seat belt design in his 1995 Ford Mercury Marquis
Shelby Plaintiff:	2243 Stephen Offutt, Baltimore, MD	\$33,591,900	Following a routine pre-natal visit in the morning, a high risk expectant mother was sent by wheelchair for an urgent delivery – the attending approved a resident’s plan to wait until the afternoon – the baby was not delivered until six hours after admission and 79 minutes beyond the plan – the child suffered severe and permanent brain jury
Shelby Plaintiff:	1338 James Lees, Charleston, WV William Raiford, Clarksdale, MS and Philip Stroud, Southaven, MS	\$23,600,000	A young woman (24) reported a lump in her breast to her Ob-Gyn – the doctor thought it was nothing – months later the plaintiff was diagnosed with terminal cancer
Fed-Chatt Plaintiff:	1624 Randall Kinnard and Daniel Clayton, Nashville	\$22,266,261	Suffering a broken leg in a serious car wreck, the plaintiff was hospitalized – she left the hospital six days later paralyzed from the waist down – in this lawsuit, she sought damages from a variety of defendants, blaming her injury on complications from a spinal catheter that had been placed to relieve pain
Shelby Plaintiff:	2054 Gayle Malone, Jr. , Charles Malone and Steven Anderson, Nashville	\$20,000,000	An anesthesiologist was blamed for mismanaging a fatal infection in a patient who had undergone a kidney stone surgery – the estate of the patient, who had been a successful real estate developer, sought some \$40 million in economic loss at trial
Davidson Plaintiff:	61 Todd Rose, Paris, Les Jones Memphis and Rosella Shackelford, Clarksville	\$16,400,000	A pediatric urologist botched a scrotal surgery and removed almost all of an infant’s bladder
Weakley Plaintiff:	2297 Randall Kinnard and Mary Ellen Morris, Nashville and Roy Herron, Dresden	\$15,261,070	A teenager was on a tracheostomy tube after a serious wreck – a month later and transferred to a rehabilitation hospital, the boy sustained a catastrophic brain injury when the breathing tube was removed too soon
